OUR APPROACH TO HOLISTIC LEARNING & DEVELOPMENT

At Enishi International School, students grow from age 1 to 18 through a continuous learning journey shaped by the International Baccalaureate (IB). Beginning with the Primary Years Programme (PYP) in preschool, they build curiosity and foundational skills. In middle school, the IB Middle Years Programme (MYP) deepens critical thinking and global awareness. By high school, students engage in the IB Diploma Programme (DP), preparing for university and life with academic rigor, research, and service.

Learning is personalized through small group instruction, language development, and real-world projects. Cultural events, international exchanges, and cross-grade communities like Eagle Nests help students connect, lead, and apply their learning in diverse contexts.

Our Schoolwide Learner Outcomes shape students into multilingual, principled, and open-minded global citizens. By graduation, they are confident thinkers, respectful collaborators, and compassionate leaders—ready to make a difference in a changing world.



Early Learning Centre (ELC) Ages 14 months - 6 years

- A nurturing environment for children aged 14 months to 6 years.
- Foundation classes (14 months-3 years) follow the EYFS framework, building early skills in a caring setting.
- Preschool to Kindergarten (3–6 years) follow the EYFS framework and the IB
 Primary Years Programme, focusing on independence and emotional growth.
- Daily outdoor play supports physical development and social interaction.
- Nap time in Foundation is included to support healthy routines.
- Monthly field trips for Pre-K and Kindergarten connect learning to real-world experiences.
- Play-based, hands-on activities encourage creativity and exploration.





Primary Years Programme (PYP) Ages 6 - 12 years

- PYP focuses on literacy, student agency, and globalmindedness.
- Strong multilingual readers and writers through reading groups and targeted instruction.
- MAP Growth data informs personalized teaching.
- Eagle Nests promote leadership, care, and community.
- Student voice and choice encouraged via Student Council and service.
- PYP Exhibition (PYPX) showcases passion-driven projects and growth.









Middle Years Programme (MYP) (Grades 6 - 10)

- Academically rigorous, inquiry-based framework fostering interdisciplinary connections.
- Covers sciences, humanities, mathematics, and the arts.
- Develops critical thinking, independence, and international-mindedness.
- Includes service learning, extracurricular activities, and leadership opportunities.
- Grade 10 Personal Project allows students to complete a self-directed research project.





Diploma Programme (DP) Grades 11 - 12

- The Diploma Programme at Enishi emphasizes academic excellence, critical thinking, independent research, and global awareness.
- Students select 6 subjects from following key areas: sciences, humanities, mathematics, languages, and the arts.
- Core components:
 - Extended Essay (EE) a 4,000-word independent research paper
 - Theory of Knowledge (TOK) exploring how we know what we know
 - Creativity, Activity, and Service (CAS) personal growth through realworld experiences
- CAS and school initiatives connect students with the Nagoya community through volunteering, student-run clubs, and service projects.
- These experiences foster empathy, leadership, and a commitment to making meaningful change.
- Enishi DP graduates are recognized by top universities worldwide for their academic preparation and community impact.
- Students are required to complete and pass the IB DP exams.



High School Program (Non-DP) Grades 11 - 12

- Offers a flexible, international curriculum tailored to individual student goals and pathways.
- Focuses on academic growth, critical thinking, and practical skills for life beyond school.
- Students study core subjects such as English, mathematics, science, and humanities, alongside other electives.
- Supports students in developing independence, communication skills, and global awareness.
- Prepares students for university, vocational pathways, or careers through personalized learning and college counseling.

Preschool welcomes children aged 3 to 4, focusing on exploration, play, and early learning.




Kindergarten serves children aged 5 to 6, preparing them for primary school through inquiry and foundational skills.

Student Support Services

Why might a child need school counseling?

- In Primary (PYP), the focus is often on helping students learn how to manage big feelings like worry, frustration, or sadness.
- In Secondary, support centers around handling anxiety, developing academic skills, and strengthening Approaches to Learning (ATL) skills.
- Whenever there's an emotional need whether it's stress, anger, confusion, or just feeling "off" — the counselor offers a safe space and supportive guidance.
- To help students grow, reflect, and develop their own unique personalities.

- Bus Routes: Three convenient routes cover key areas across Nagoya.





Admissions

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

STEPPING IN

All students must go through an assessment process (including language proficiency tests where applicable) in order to be admitted to Enishi.

EARLY LEARNING CENTER

For Foundation Class, children must be at least 14 months old and able to walk independently. Children applying for Preschool and Pre-K Class must be toilet trained. Applicants for the Early Learning Center should also demonstrate the ability to separate from parents, basic self-help skills, and age-appropriate language development. Basic English communication is expected for Kindergarten Class.

PRIMARY SCHOOL

Elementary students are assessed on their age-appropriate social skills, language ability, and academic skills. Students must generally have sufficient competency in English to participate in the academic programs. For students who need extra support, Enishi provides English as an Additional Language (EAL) classes.

MIDDLE SCHOOL

Middle school students are admitted based on academic ability, personal interests, behavior, and attendance records. They must demonstrate English language proficiency.

HIGH SCHOOL

High school students are admitted based on academic ability, extracurricular interests, future goals, and their overall behavior and classroom performance. Students must demonstrate English language proficiency.
